



Parley First School
PE Grant Statement 2021 -22

Since 2013, the Government has allocated additional funding to schools to spend on physical education (PE). This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of primary-aged pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles. Each school will receive £16,000 plus an amount of £10 per pupil each academic year.

Our funding for the 3-year period ended 31 August 2022 has been confirmed and amounts to £55,778. The allocation received by academic year was as follows:

- 2019-20: £18,480
- 2020-21: £18,468 Plus (12,565 unspent from 2020/21)
- 2021-22: £18510

In 2021-22, the funding allocation available to spend (including carry forward) was **£31075** and it was used as follows:
