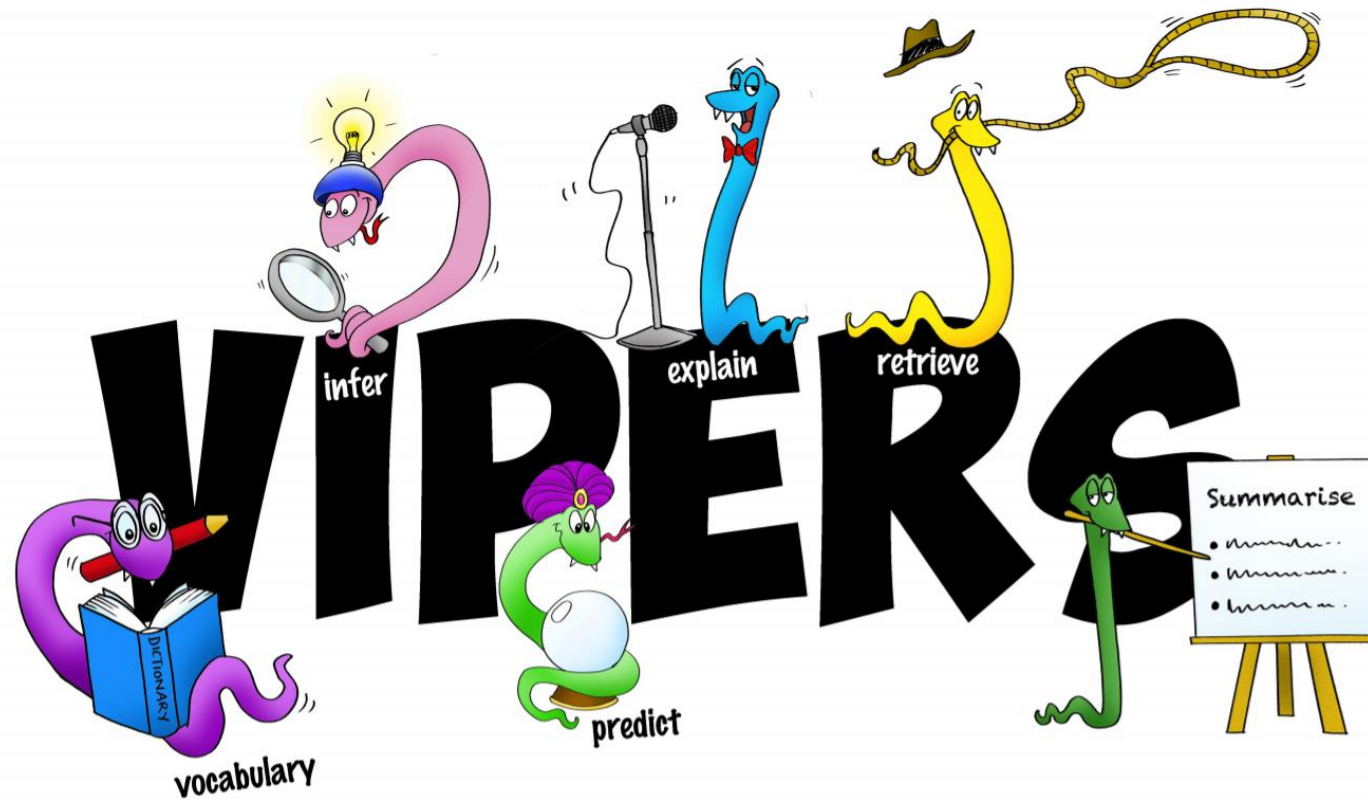


How do we teach word reading?

- Children will learn the pure sounds
- Children will be taught the technique of decoding.
- Fluency skills – children need to be blending sounds in their head quickly to allow for meaning and understanding.



How do we teach Whole Class Reading?



What are VIPERS?

VIPERS teaches children the key fundamental skills on reading beyond word reading. This allows children to really understand and interpret what they are reading.

- Vocabulary – meaning of words in a concept – why authors have used the word
- Infer – hidden meanings in a text – evidence
- Predict – What will happen next or in the future?
- Explain - in more detail
- Retrieval – find it question
- S – KS1 –Sequence– Order events
- S – KS2 –Summarise-What has happened so far?

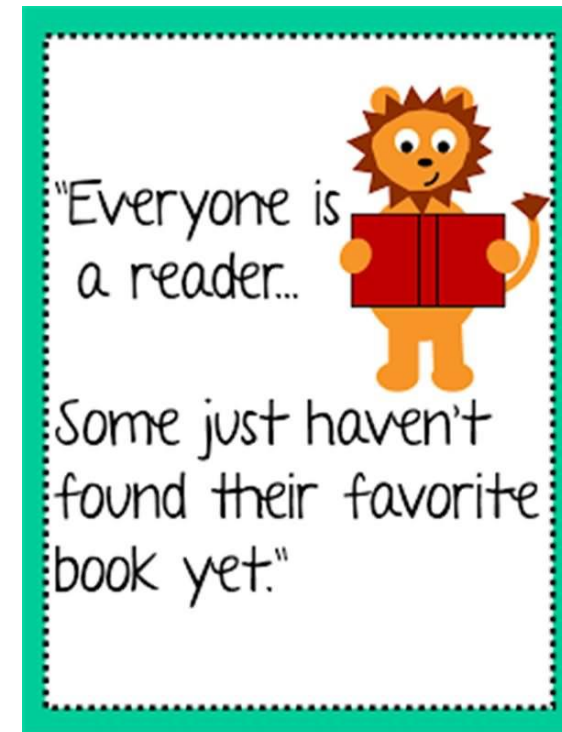
