

The impact of COVID-19 on spending during the Academic Year 2020- 2021 has been significant. We have adapted our annual report to try and reflect this and the support that was put in place during the lockdown periods. This continues to be a challenge in 2021 and will need to be adapted as the school follows Government Guidelines.

Since 2013, the Government has allocated additional funding to schools to spend on physical education (PE). This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of primary-aged pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles. Each school will receive £16,000 plus an amount of £10 per pupil each academic year.

Our funding for the 3-year period ended 31 August 2020 has been confirmed and amounts to £55,778. The allocation received by academic year was as follows:

2018-19: £18,8302019-20: £18,480

• 2020-21: £18,468 Plus (12,565 unspent from 2019/20)

In 2020-21, the funding allocation available to spend (including carry forward) was £31,033 and it was used as follows:

£12,565 of the funding available in the period ended 31 August 2021 is being strategically carried forward into the academic year 2021-22 to support the planned delivery of high quality Physical Education Lessons. The predicted total funding available for the academic year 2021-22 is zero due

to the Sports Grant being removed. We have taken the decision to use the underspend due to COVID- 19 to extend provision split over two more years .
