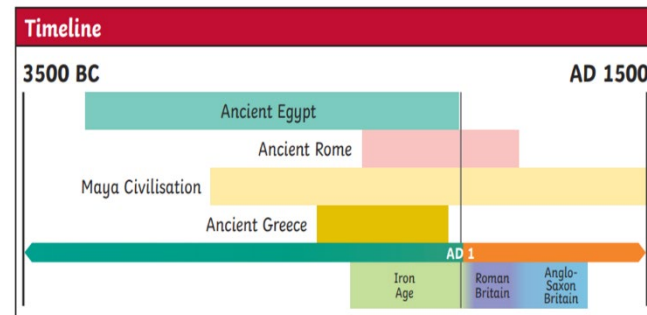


The Romans – Knowledge Organiser

Knows:

1. The Romans lived in Rome. They wanted to spread the Roman Empire. The Romans tried to invade Britain under Julius Caesar's reign.
2. Many Celts realized how powerful the Roman Army was and agreed to obey Roman laws and pay taxes. Other tribes of Celts continued to fight against the Romans, who never gained full control of Britain.
3. Boudicca (The warrior queen) led her army against the Romans. She was defeated.
4. That the romans brought many modern inventions to improve living in the UK.

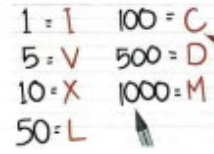


The Roman Impact

Bath houses with hot spring water

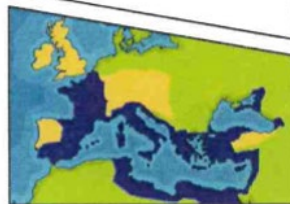


Straight Roads

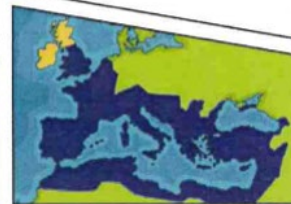


Large stone houses with central heating and many rooms called villas

Vocabulary	Definition
Roman Empire	Every country / area that was invaded by the Romans became part of the Empire, which were all ruled by the Emperor in Rome.
Invasion	One country attacking another to take it over.
Emperor	The leader of an empire. Similar to a king or queen.
Celts	People living in Britain and some parts of Europe after the Iron Age.
Iceni Tribe	Boudicca's tribe of Celts that led the rebellion against the Romans in Britain.
Rebellion	A rebellion is an attempt to take over a leadership or government.
Army	A large group of people that are trained to fight for or protect their country.
Latin	The Language spoken in the Roman Empire.
Villa	A Roman home which was often made of stone.
Roman Numerals	The Roman system for counting based on seven different symbols. I, V, X, L, C, D, M.
