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Head Teacher Update

Welcome back! I hope that you have all head a great half term break despite the lovely weather we had. This week has certainly been an exciting one for many of our children with the excitement of Tuesday evening followed by the lovely storm yesterday. Thankfully we were able to remain open although we did experience some flooding in the classrooms and around the school. Unfortunately it is an issue that isn't a quick fix and this more extreme weather is putting pressure on the drainage system. It didn't stop us teaching and it certainly didn't stop the children learning. I did take the decision to keep the children inside at all points during the day yesterday though due to the high winds as well as the ground being saturated which increases the risk of trees potentially falling.

I suspect it won't be the last one and that is why it is important for us to continue to teach the children about the environment they live in and how to look after it. Our Year 3 children went on a vey successful off site visit to Durlston Country Park on Tuesday this week, where they were learning about the Jurassic Coast and how important it is as a World Heritage Site. The children really gained a huge amount from this bespoke visit, one we could not recreate in the classroom.

We also had a visit from a representative from the UK Parliament this week for our Year 3 and 4 children to talk to them about democracy and what that means. It is all part of our work to teach children about British values. You may have noticed that we have a new external display on the walls trying to promote the five areas of British values. The children seemed to really enjoy the session and had some great questions. You never know, there could be a future politician among them and may inspire them to that route.

Next week we will have more visitors to the school from AFC Bournemouth who will be talking to the children with an anti racism message. They have also been working with our Year 4 children over the past few weeks teaching about diversity.

POPS are very busy organizing a number of events coming up in the month of November. We are holding Discos next week and then on to one of our main events, The Christmas Market on Friday 24th November which is always a really great event (unless these storms hit of course!) All of the money raised will be re-invested into the school for the benefit of the children.

Just a little reminder to everyone that no cars should be driven into the school car park at the beginning and end of the school day. I will try and get out on the gates but shouldn't need to. I have also reminded parents who have pre-school children at Rainbows End. Thank you very much.

Bonfire Night Safety

Please read the following safety information from Dorset and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service.

This time of year there are many opportunities to celebrate, especially with sparklers, bonfires, fireworks and candles. We would like to encourage you to talk to your children about how they can stay safe near fire. Simple actions such as wearing gloves when using sparklers, keeping matches, lighters and fireworks out of children's reach, keeping everyone a safe distance from fireworks and bonfires can all help towards a safe celebration. Help your child understand the importance of being safe around candles, especially if wearing a fancy dress costume. It is safer to have battery operated candles in pumpkins. Make sure you have working smoke alarms in your home and everyone knows the escape plan. With the change of daylight hours it is important that children dress brightly to be seen when they are out and about, if you are walking near water take extra care as it maybe more slippery with leaves and mud on the banks.
