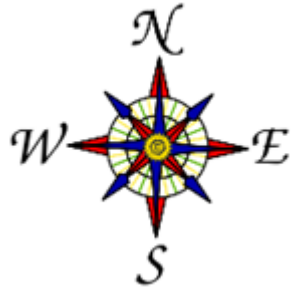


# Pesky Pirates Year 2 - Knowledge Organiser

## Geography Compass Points

A compass helps us to navigate using set points- north, south, east and west.



## Continents and Oceans

### Harry Paye



1360 - 1419

1. Harry Paye was a Pirate and Smuggler from Poole.
2. He intercepted hundreds of ships off the Dorset coast.
3. He stole from the rich and gave to the poor.
4. He brought back their precious cargo: wine, gold exotic food to share with the people of Poole. They saw him as a hero!

### Alfred Wallis

1. Alfred Wallis was a painter who was known for his port landscapes and shipping scenes
2. He painted on scraps of cardboard
3. He used black and white to lighten and darken the colour

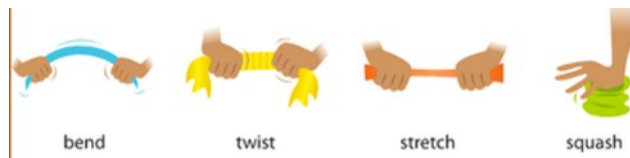


## Music

We will be learning what a sea shanty is and some different ones to learn and perform, focussing on tune and identifying the different elements that are within a piece of music

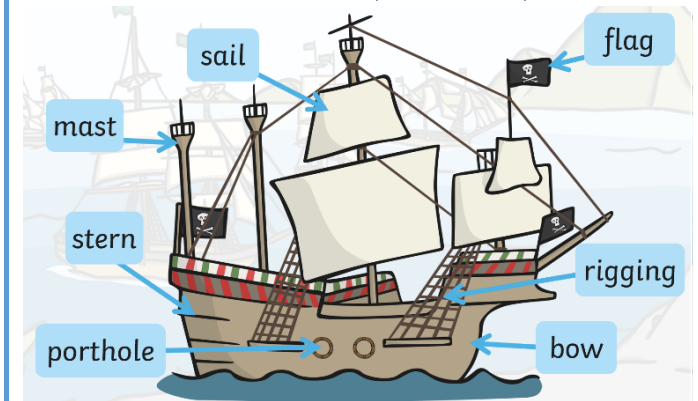
## Science

## Life of a Pirate

Parts of a pirate ship



<u>Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Ocean	A very large expanse of sea.
Continent	A large, continuous mass of land.
Pirate	A pirate is a sailor who attacks other ships at sea and steals their property.
Piracy	Piracy is an act of attacking and robbing ships at sea.
Cutlass	A short sword with a slightly curved blade used by pirates.
Booty	Treasure (like money or jewels) stolen by pirates.
Properties	This is what a material is like and how it behaves.
Transparent	Something you can see through.
Opaque	Something you can't see through.
Waterproof	Something that keeps water out.
