On Tuesday, we were delighted to welcome residents from a local care home. It is always so lovely to see the wonderful interactions between the children and residents.

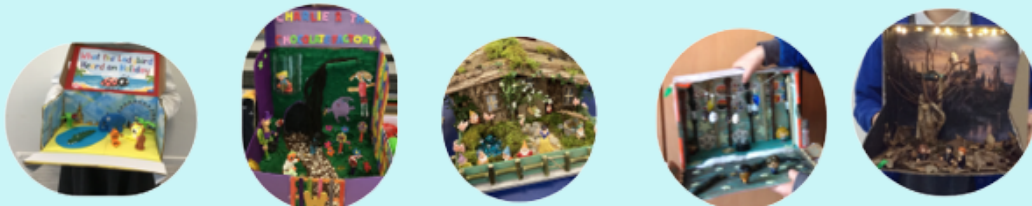
