## PEARDROPS PAYMENTS

Unfortunately a number of parents are not adhering to the terms and conditions of payment for Peardrops. Please note we will no longer be able to book same day sessions if there are still outstanding fees owed. Please check ParentMail and clear any outstanding fees by Monday 4<sup>th</sup> May. All payments must be cleared before we move over to Arbor for payments.

Peardrops dates for Summer 2 will open on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> May. Bookings and payments will now be handled on Arbor and as usual, handled on a first come, first served basis. Please read the information below regarding important changes in the payment process. Thank you very much.

## IMPORTANT - ARBOR PAYMENTS

- Parents eligible for the reduced Free School Meal rate will now need to pay\_for sessions at the time of booking.
- Parents paying by childcare voucher must book sessions and make payment immediately afterwards via their chosen provider.
- Accounts must be topped up sufficiently in order to book any sessions (excluding those paying by childcare voucher).

## HEADTEACHER UPDATE

It has been a great week. I have been really pleased with the children's behaviour and learning since we have returned from the Easter break. The weather certainly helps and being on the field is a VERY happy place for the children. It is lovely to watch such positive play. I feel very proud of the way in which our children interact and support each other and when they do fall out, they are able to restore these relationships quickly which is a great skill to have in life.

After a little wait, our Year 3 children got to go on an educational visit that had to be postponed due to the very poor weather conditions earlier in the year. I must say it was a much more enjoyable experience for everyone involved rather than sitting on a coach for three hours which would have happened last time the trip was planned. That real life practical learning cannot be underestimated and the educational visits we take the children on take a huge amount of planning due to ensuring a whole range of factors are in place linked to both Health and Safety requirements and to ensure the learning is as effective as it can be to maximise the use of the time out of school.

Year 2 also had a morning of drama and reenactment linked to their topic of Castles where the hall was transformed back to Medieval times and the children seemed to really enjoy bringing History to life with the Treehouse Theatre Company. Thank you again to POPS for enabling this enrichment experience for the children.

We have also had a Governors meeting this week which was positive. One of the duties we complete at these meetings in addition to many other aspects is to agree policies for the School. One of the most significant ones we have changed to meet the new legislation is the RHSE Policy (Formerly known as PHSE Policy). There are a number of changes to this policy and I wanted to share it with you so you are also aware of what we are expected to teach to our children as part of the Relationships, Health and Sex Education Policy.
