## HEADTEACHER UPDATE

Well at least it is a little cooler this week. I can certainly tell that the children and adults all need a break now. It is always an interesting time of the year with change and heat and all sorts of events happening.

Obviously tonight we have our Summer Fair and I am incredibly grateful to the POPS team, the staff and to you of course for supporting this event.

The POPS funding makes a significant difference to the school for those nice to have things that really benefit all of the children. This year we are using the funding to replace the Teletubby Mounds on the school field which the children love to use either at play and lunchtimes or during our outdoor learning sessions.

### HAF FUNDED HOLIDAY CLUBS

We now have a holiday club on site for the whole of the summer holidays, run from The Cabin and using the school grounds. Some of these places are fully funded for our Pupil Premium children and we still have some places available. I just wanted to put a little reminder in about the new Pupil Premium funding for September. The Government have changed the way schools are funded for Free School Meals which means that possibly more families will be entitled to Free School Meals. It is really important that we capture the correct data from you so that the school also receives the correct amount of funding. You should have received a separate letter from us a couple of weeks ago with more information about the criteria based on Universal Credit and income.

Thank you very much. It is an incredibly busy time of the year and the heat doesn't help with children and adults struggling to sleep properly, so basic needs are not being met. Hopefully, I will see many of you tonight if you are able to come along and have some fun.
